## How to Solve Word Seeks



The words in the list are hidden in the diagram of letters. Find them by reading forward, backward, up, down, and diagonally. Do not skip over any letters. Some of the letters in the diagram are used in more than one word; some are not used in any words.

When you find a word in the diagram, circle it and put a check in the small square next to the word in the word list.

Only words in CAPITAL LETTERS in the word list are hidden in the diagram. Words in parentheses and those not in all CAPITAL LETTERS are not in the diagram—they are there for descriptive purposes only. If two forms of the same word (JOY and JOYFUL, for example) are in the word list, they will be found in different places in the diagram.
