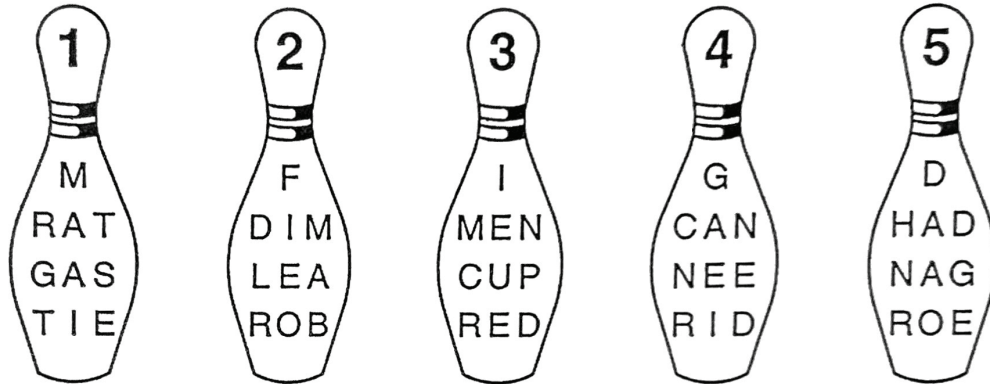

# BOWL GAME

To bowl a strike (worth 20 points) in our bowling game, use all the letters in the pin to form a 10-letter word. The letter on top in the pin is the first letter of the strike word. To bowl a spare (worth 10 points), use the same 10 letters to form two words. Splits are not allowed—a spare may not be formed by splitting the strike word in two (for example, the strike word "SWEETHEART" cannot be split into the spare "SWEET" and "HEART"). Words starting with a capital letter may not be used.

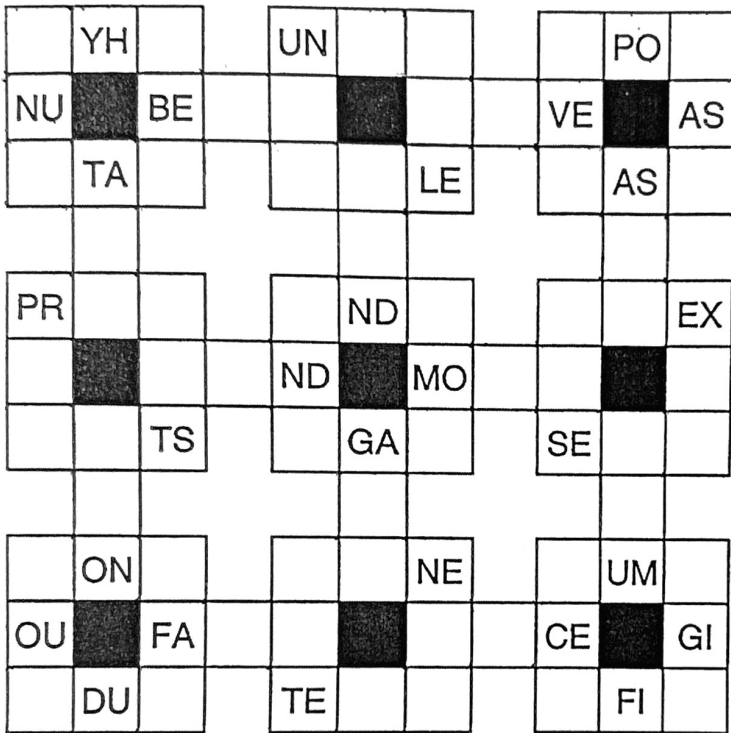
Place the nine words into the diagram, one word for each row, so that one of the columns reading down will spell out a nine-letter word that is related to the others. Each given letter is part of one word.

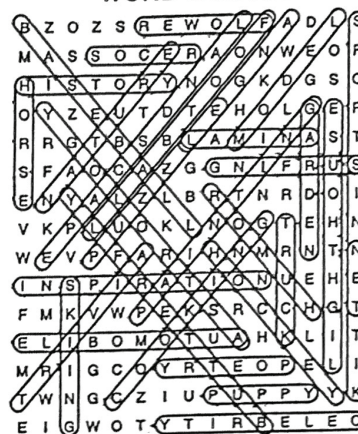
